What does it mean to be a global citizen?

What is in your leadership toolkit? How can you communicate more effectively? What is your leadership style? How are you perceived by others? How can you improve your time management skills and be more accountable? What are your values? What risks are you willing to take to reach your goals? What risks are you willing to take to reach your goals? What is your place in society? How can you engage in global issues? What impact do you want to have on your community and the world? How can you motivate and inspire others?

The twenty students who will be selected for PAAC's Global Leadership Program in 2015 – 2016 will explore these questions, and more. This 9 month program aims to improve participants' leadership skills, including effective communication, appreciation for diversity, public speaking, goal setting, accountability, and conflict resolution. Our goal is to develop global citizens who are informed about global issues, empowered to make a difference, and feel connected with others around the world. Program components address personal leadership, social identity development, intercultural sensitivity, and global citizenship. Students will engage in global issues and take leadership roles at PAAC's High School Program events in the fall and spring and complete a final leadership project in their school or district.

Students who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply:

- Currently in grades 10 and 11
- Available on all program dates
- On Oahu, or able to arrange own travel to Oahu for all program dates
- Demonstrated leadership, maturity, and responsibility

- Demonstrated interest in international affairs
- Current GPA 3.0 or higher (unless nominated by school counselor)

Program Cost: \$50. Includes camp, meals on workshops days, and conference registration fees. Participants will receive a scholarship from Qatar Foundation International to cover the program tuition.

Required Application Materials:

- On-line application form
- Parent/Guardian consent form
- Essay
- Most recent school transcript
- Teacher sponsor and recommendation form and letter

Each student in this program must have a teacher sponsor at their school who supports by:

- Submitting a recommendation form and letter
- Attending PAAC's Global Vision Summit (GVS) on March 5, 2016
- Assisting the student in organizing an in-school event based on the simulation done at GVS (this may include working with the school administration, reserving a room, placing notices in the school bulletin, copying materials, collecting registration forms, etc.)
- Attending the in-school event- date will be set by teacher and student together
- Please note: Teacher sponsors will be invited to attend all sessions of the program, although only GVS and the in-school event are required

Application Process:

- On-line application with supporting documents submitted by midnight on Sept 13, 2015.
- Finalists will be contacted to attend a group interview and leadership event on Saturday, September 19, at the East West Center, University of Hawaii at Manoa.
- Program participants will be announced by September 25.
- PAAC Global Leadership Program will begin at Camp Molukeia on October 3, 2015.
