Guidelines

- The Creative Challenge Art Contest is open to all Hawai'i students in 6th 8th grade.
- Artwork must be original. No copyrighted or trademarked artwork will be accepted for judging.
- Your entry must include positive and accurate messaging about organ and tissue donation.
- Entry must be 8.5"h x 11"w HORIZONTAL
- · Your entry must not have grammatical or spelling errors.
- Attach your completed official entry form to your entry (must be legible if you wish to receive certificate of participation and prizes).
- All entries become the property of Legacy of Life Hawai'i and will not be returned.
- Use materials that can be easily reproduced, such as tempera, graphic design, watercolor, pen & ink, etc.

Awards and Prizes

- All entrants will receive a Certificate of Participation.
- The 12 finalists will receive a \$50 VISA gift card and a copy of the printed calendar.
- The overall winner will receive a \$100 VISA gift card and a copy of the printed calendar.
- The overall winning design will be reproduced as a poster and used in state/government hospitals and libraries throughout the state.

Helpful Hints for Students

Know your mission

Read the instructions that were supplied by Legacy of Life Hawai'i and then read them again to make sure you understand. Designs are often rejected outright simply because instructions were not followed and rules were not adhered to.

Spelling Counts!

Of all the rules that are commonly broken, misspelling words is at the top of the list. The most often misspelled word? Donor! That's D-O-N-O-R *not* E-R!

Van Gogh or Just Plain Joe

You don't need to be an "artist" to do well in this contest. You should, however, be neat, organized in both thought and action and have a good idea of how you will promote organ and tissue donation.

Plan your design before you start to draw. Know where you will put everything and ask for feedback. Think about colors, texture, and if your eye moves smoothly from one element to the next.

Keep it Simple

Most people in the community know very little about organ and tissue donation, so it's important to be simple and un-complicated in your design and tag lines. Think about symbolism!

Limit the number of colors you use to no more than four. Multiple colors may confuse a person's eyes and make them wander around your design.

Since this is for a calendar, consider including a special holiday theme in your design.

Don't Gross Me Out!

While it's true, organs and tissue are removed from people's bodies after they die, drawing of dead people with their organs popping out and skeletons holding their hearts in their hands are not very appealing. Let's focus on the positive side.

Most importantly, use your imagination and feelings. That's what art is all about!
