## Come Receive the Light, but Pass It On!

Here you are, fasting, preparing for Holy Week, and very soon you will be called to "Come receive the light from the unwaning light, and glorify Christ, Who has risen from the dead." But if and when you answer this call, and find yourself standing in Church on the Saturday before Pascha with candle in hand, what will you do with that light? Will it go no further than the narthex of the Church? Or perhaps carefully carried to your house only to be extinguished in the early morning? Or will you "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven?" (Mat. 5:16)

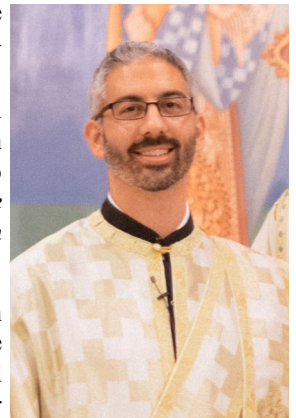
Pascha is the height of our Liturgical cycle because as Christ is crucified on the cross and resurrected three days later, God's creation is restored. We are no longer separated from Him by the darkness of death in this world. God created this world out of nothing. "The earth was invisible and unfinished; and darkness was over the deep. [...] Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. God saw the light; it was good;" (Gen. 1:2-3) But when Adam fell, he separated mankind from that light, making us susceptible to the darkness. Christ, the Light, has come to unite us again and give us eternal life. This is the glory of Pascha and this is why we celebrate. Because death and darkness no longer hold dominion over those who have Christ, our risen Lord gives us great hope!

However, we are still bound to this world and the darkness still affects us if we allow it to do so. We know this because great suffering and strife exist, and we do not have to look very far for examples of this. Christ tells us that if we only see the darkness it can corrupt our entire body and that the light in us will be darkness. (Mat. 6:22-23) We must seek the light to keep that from happening, and we do this by attending Divine services, learning more about what He wants for us, and then putting that into practice. Christ says "I am light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." (John 8:12) He is present here and now and wants us to seek not the destructive forces of this world but the light of creation.

Your presence at the Resurrection Service and Divine Liturgy is an essential part of that experience, but it is only the beginning. As we each receive the light on Saturday evening, we also turn to our fellow brother or sister and pass it on to them. This is not just a symbolic gesture, but a physical manifestation for how we will live our entire lives as Christians. When we joyously chant "Christ is Risen" it is with the expectation that we will share this news with all the world. So will we allow that light to burn out moments or hours after we celebrate? Or will we take that light and share it with all those we encounter, no matter who they are. If we truly believe what we chant, then we must choose the latter. I wish you all a blessed and joyous Pascha, Kali Anastasi!

**Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!**

## 2015 Festival

Seems like we just had the Festival last week, but here we are again gearing up for the next one. October 9th, 10th, and 11th are the dates for the 2015 Seattle Greek Festival. I will wait till after Pascha to have our first festival planning meeting. So far we have committed to the new dates, changed some layout plans, and discussed some pricing changes. I have also been working with Puget Sound Energy and Olson Fuel Company to propose the placement of a second gas meter for the Festival only. The cost of this placement and the installation of the quick connect valves is the only hurdle we currently have to completing this wish. The advantage of natural gas on demand versus spending hours during the festival filling and getting more propane tanks, and the cost savings of Natural gas versus propane will over the years be a huge money saving benefit. If anybody is willing to underwrite this project please give me a call so I can proceed with this idea.

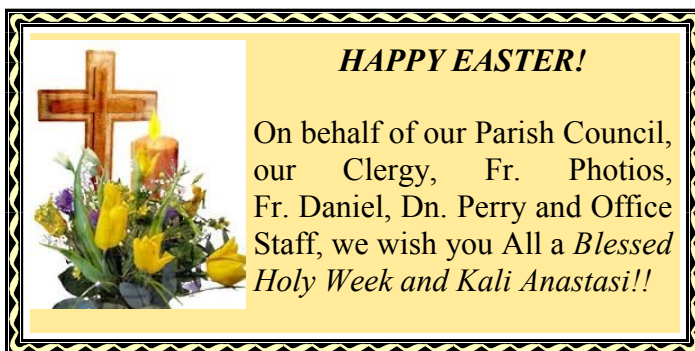

### 2015 Maintenance update

The dome roof repairs are finally complete, You will notice that the valleys of the dome roof are no longer holding standing water and that the small hall and narthex bullet roofs are also sealed and not holding any standing water. Next we need to be concerned about our flat roofs over the Church Sunday school and main Church hall ways. This flat roof work was scheduled to last until 2020, so we are 5 years from the flat roofs meeting their expected life. I will propose that this summer we bring in a roofing company and inspect all flat roofs for any voids and have them sealed. This type of preventive maintenance could buy us a few more years down the road.

Another thing you will soon see is the dance floors refinished and carpeting replaced in the small hall. The roof contractor did not protect the roof over the summer and is paying for the floor finishing and our friend John Boukallis of JB Carpets has donated the carpeting in the small hall. Thank you to George Constantine for his leadership in getting the new Lynn Street entry walls and the sign placed. Along with the Pine tree removals around the sign and some future lighting and landscaping this will be a great improvement to our facility and the Montlake community.

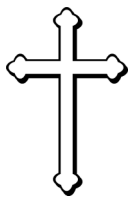
