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Summer Assignments:

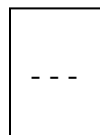
(Due by Monday, Aug. 22nd)

1a. Write an essay that consists of 3 paragraphs in which each paragraph consists of 3-5 complete sentences. The essay should be neatly handwritten in pencil using your best cursive or printed writing. Please write on a clean, white, 3-hole punched, line sheet of notebook paper. Please do not type the essay. Within the essay, answer the question; What can I do to make a difference to others this year?

Dear Parents,

Please allow students to write as their ability allows. It would be great if you can guide them with possible ideas, spelling, and neatness but let them show me their natural ability. I will assess students on neatness and use of complete sentences ☺.

1b. Create a picture or drawing collage of your favorite foods, animals, sports, games, colors, TV shows, things to do, etc.! Please use **HALF OF A POSTER BOARD (you can get a poster board from the Dollar Tree and cut it in ½ width-wise. Create the poster so it ends up in the **VERTICAL** position). I want to share and display these works of art, but we have 26 students in our class so I want the posters to be able to fit in our room ☺). I will assess students on neatness and showing effort and pride in their work!**



Cut in ½, then turn one half to the vertical position ☺.





2. Supplies Needed (Bring on the first day of school):
