## Wisconsin Meeting's a Hit!

Entomology Professor Chris Williamson informed the group about insects in the nursery. Liesl Thomas from W & E Radtke discussed branding and how it works at her nursery. During lunch, Tom Bergen, Tom Buechel and Mike Gates presented an overview of McKay Nursery. Following lunch the group toured McKay, highlighting their production and propagation practices. They saw in action the cheese cloth softwood propagation method Mike Gates presented at the 2013 IPPS annual meeting. McKay is trialing a lot of things from direct sticking into #2 containers to cover cropping with a combination of radishes and clover. One attendee thought that the fiberglass tree stakes used by McKay looked like an improvement over the electrical conduits used in his nursery. The rooted cutting (*below right*) is a direct stick into a root maker pot, which is a type of root pruning pot. The picture shows the pruning that is done by the pot.
