One of ten districts across Louisiana, MHSD was created by the state legislature in 2003 to oversee the delivery of publicly-funded, community-based mental health, addictive disorders and developmental disabilities services to our area. MHSD serves adults, children and families of Orleans, Plaquemines and St. Bernard Parishes. In particular, we serve residents who are uninsured or Medicaid eligible, though developmental disabilities services do not have income restrictions.

Psychiatrists are the primary caregivers at Metropolitan Human Services District. During the assessment phase of care, all clients have their mental health/substance abuse needs assessed. The treatment team will then link the client with community resources to meet those needs as well as admit the client for Medication Management with MHSD.

Candidates may qualify for the Loan Repayment Program through the National Health Service Corps. Click on the link below for more information.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

Possession of a valid Louisiana certificate to practice as a Physician as issued by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

**NOTE:**

**Examples of Work:**

- Prescribe, direct, or administer psychotherapeutic treatments or medications to treat mental, emotional, or behavioral disorders.
- Analyze and evaluate patient data or test findings to diagnose nature or extent of mental disorder.
- Collaborate with physicians, psychologists, social workers, psychiatric nurses, or other professionals to discuss treatment plans and progress.
- Design individualized care plans, using a variety of treatments.
- Gather and maintain patient information and records, including social or medical history obtained from patients, relatives, or other professionals.
- Counsel outpatient or other patients during office visits
- Examine or conduct laboratory or diagnostic tests on patients to provide information on general physical condition or mental disorder.
- Serve as a patient advocate by treating clients with dignity and respect
