1007 East Grand Avenue

Built in 1886, the Iowa State Capitol is a landmark with its 23k gold leaf covered dome that is flanked by four smaller domes. The interior has 29 different types of marble and 24 fireplaces. After years of restoration, the exterior is spectacular and the interior is stunning. This tour will visit the House of Representatives, the Senate, the Law Library, and the dome (optional).
