

Save box tops and earn for local schools

If you save box tops from cereals, snacks, paper goods and other products, you can contribute to the funding of Bloomfield public school programs.

In the last nine years, Bloomfield’s K-8 schools have earned \$114,000 through Box Tops for Education, the school earnings loyalty program of food manufacturer General Mills. The company donates 10¢ per box top, up to \$20,000 per school per year.

Franklin Elementary School and Bloomfield Middle School each earned more than \$3,000 in the 2014-2015 school year.

General Mills pays for box tops of more than 250 products. To find out which ones qualify, go to <https://www.boxtops4education.com/login>.

Three ways to participate in the program:

- Clip box tops and send them to your chosen school.
- Go to <https://www.boxtops4education.com/login> and select a school. When you shop at partner retailers (like ShopRite of Bloomfield), your school will be credited automatically for eBox Tops.
- Use Box Tops drop-off containers at ShopRite and the Bloomfield Library to support all Bloomfield schools equally, instead of one particular school.

Money earned from Box Tops for Education goes into the “home and school budget” of the district or selected school to supplement school programs.
