Overview and Background

Each year 8th grade students take the ERB Comprehensive Testing Program as part of the placement process for New Trier High School. Four areas are assessed: verbal reasoning, reading comprehension, quantitative reasoning, and mathematics. This year's ERB scores were presented at the January board meeting.

As shared in January, this year's cohort has demonstrated a higher reading comprehension score than last year's cohort. The current cohort demonstrated lower scores in quantitative reasoning and mathematics. While there is not a discernible pattern from one year to the next, several steps are being taken to better understand the results.

Continue Articulation with New Trier

The math department chair and math facilitator will continue to attend Township Articulation meetings with New Trier. Two Winnetka Parent Institutes have taken place: one specifically focused on math instruction. On February 10, the Winnetka math curriculum was presented and Paul Sally, Assistant Superintendent at New Trier, shared that Winnetka students are successful in the high school math program. Dr. Linda Yonke, Superintendent of New Trier, presented on February 18. Prior to the end of the school year, another New Trier staff member will be invited to speak with Washburne teachers regarding the ERB and its use in the placement process.

Maintain a Focus on Reading Comprehension and Verbal Reasoning

The current School Improvement Plan includes a focus on reading. Participation in school book groups and the school-wide reading program has risen. Sessions have been held for parents regarding the teaching of reading and a parent book group is starting. The Social Studies department has begun a study of "Reading Like A Historian" developed by the Stanford History Education Group. (This information can be found in the School Improvement Plan update.) The Language Arts department has begun the process of developing common reading units.
