

Informational Memo: 2014-2015 New Trier Freshman Perception Survey

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Overview & Background

For the past six years, students at New Trier High School have been surveyed during the spring of their freshman year. The survey provides a summary of student perceptions of their preparedness for high school. New Trier also provides information on freshmen enrollment in a variety of levels of courses. Finally, questions are also asked about a variety of topics including organizational skills, homework, community service, and adult support at the middle school.

This report will focus on the responses of the 205 Washburne graduates. Comparisons will be drawn between the Washburne graduates and the responses of all freshman surveyed (1,104 total students).

Preparedness By Subject

Students self-rated their level of preparedness as Well Prepared, Adequately Prepared, Somewhat Prepared, and Not Prepared. Continuing with our traditional reporting of this data, the ratings of Well Prepared and Adequately Prepared will be combined and identified as "Prepared" and the ratings of Somewhat Prepared and Not Prepared will be combined and identified as "Unprepared". This report will present a summary of student perceptions of preparedness in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language. As can be seen in the tables below, our students are reporting high levels of preparedness for NTHS.

The Freshman Experience: Related Areas

New Trier also surveys freshman to learn about general preparedness, community service, the presence of a trusted adult, amount of homework, and organizational skills.

It should be noted that 87% of Washburne freshman state that their experience in the Winnetka school system prepared them to be successful at New Trier High School.

Student Enrollment in Courses by Level

The New Trier survey also provides data regarding course enrollment and requests for changes in course levels. Tables 5-8 demonstrate the distribution of Washburne graduates in each academic course by level. Table 9 reports the percentage of students who requested levels other than those recommended by New Trier.

Summary

- · 87% of Washburne graduates report they are prepared for success at New Trier High School (this is the highest percentage since the survey has been administered).
- · There have been upward trends in perceptions of preparedness in English (Literature), English (Writing), and Mathematics.
- The largest increase during the past two years has been in the perception of preparedness for Mathematics: from 77% to 87%.
- · There have been consistent increases in the related areas of general preparedness, community service opportunities, presence of a trusted adult, homework that prepares students for high school, and organizational skills
- On average, 19.25% of Washburne students take a course other than that

recommended by New Trier. On average, 70% of those course changes were to a higher level course.

The data above demonstrates that Washburne students report being prepared for their freshman year at New Trier High School. Eighty-seven percent of students reported that the Winnetka school system prepared them for a successful high school experience. When considering the historical data, Washburne students report an increase in preparedness in several areas. All this is occurring while – on average – more than 19% of students request levels of courses not originally recommended by NTHS.

The transition to high school is important. Washburne staff will review the above data to ensure we continue to provide an optimal learning experience for our students.
