

Revised Strategic Plan and Mid-Year Goal Update

Background

In December 2012, the School Board adopted a five-year Strategic Plan for The Winnetka Public Schools. This Plan incorporated a brief history of the District, its commitment to progressive education, and the creation of a community of learners. It also included a reaffirmation of the core values, educational philosophy, classroom practices, and commitment to the neighborhood school concept that would ultimately guide the planning process and goal development.

During the 2014-2015 school year, as the new Superintendent, I prioritized the need to re-engage and work collaboratively with all stakeholders to gather feedback to inform future goal setting and action.

In January 2015, a mid-year report was presented focusing on the themes that emerged from the over 65 meetings and 200+ hours spent with students, parents, staff, administration, community members, and School Board members. The results were segregated into three categories: Cross-Constituent Views, Ambitious Opportunities, and Developing a Shared Vision. Refined Strategic Plan

The refined Strategic Plan was presented to the School Board in June 2015. The Board supported a leaner plan that focused the energy into six ambitious opportunities (drivers). Modifications suggested by the Board included:

• Collapsing Student - Growth Model and Program - Special Education

- into one category and relabeling it Differentiation, and expanding the outcomes.
- Establishing a communication and long-term financial planning base for the six ambitious ideas (drivers) to accompany implementation of new initiatives.
- Enhancing professional learning systems to include implementation of methods designed to recruit, hire, develop and retain personnel.

Mid Year Update to Strategic Plan

Areas of specific focus for the 2015-2016 school year (The Big "5") evolved from the Superintendent's Entry Plan Findings and include:

- Math
 - development of clear goals, measures, and targets for student growth and achievement (content, practices and disposition)
 - o increasing parent education efforts (website, WPI)
 - o embedding technology based resources to support differentiation
- Reading
 - Finalize Curriculum (KUDs) and Develop clear goals, measures, and targets for student growth and achievement (content & disposition)
- STEAM
 - Piloting prototype environments at three schools and gathering feedback on student engagement, design thinking, and logistics including recommendation of options on program expansion.
- Kindergarten
 - Conduct feasibility study to determine if lengthening the kindergarten day is viable
- Winnetka University
 - Implement phase 1 of Winnetka University by offering courses beginning in winter and developing robust courses for 2016-2017 school year.
