President's Comments

The recent passing of **JUDGE FERRILL McRAE** marks the end of an era for Mobile's legal community. Judge McRae presided over cases here from 1965 to 2006 and impacted all of our lives as well as those of many of our clients. He was funny, colorful, opinionated, but above all intelligent, honest, and fair. At his funeral, the minister said **JUDGE McRAE's** church and family were pleasantly surprised when he went on the bench because he had been such a rascal in his youth! Judge McRae had a deep knowledge of the law and an encyclopedic memory; I talked with him at one of the bar luncheons this year and he reminded me about a case I had tried before him twenty years ago. The judge was one of a kind and will be greatly missed by both the local bar and the rest of the community.

U. S. DISTRICT JUDGE JAY ZAINEY from New Orleans recently met with a group of us, including **MUNICIPAL JUDGE SHELBONNIE COLEMAN-HALL**, about starting a **H.E.L.P. (Homeless Experience Legal Protection)** program here in Mobile. This program is operating in about fifteen cities, including Birmingham. Many homeless people have minor legal problems with which they need help in order to become housed and employed; **JUDGE ZAINEY** says that many of the problems are just common sense practical matters which the homeless simply can't handle themselves. The initial plan is to provide one attorney for a short time each week, say Mondays from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m., at 15 Place, a multi-service center for the homeless. I am looking for volunteers to cover the first several weeks of this program while we work out the kinks and get it ready for inclusion in the **VOLUNTEER LAWYERS PROGRAM**. Please call me at 694-6224 or e-mail me at hcallaway@handarendall.com if you would like to help out.

A proposed media plan to allow limited use of still and video cameras in the state court courtrooms with the consent of parties and witnesses is under discussion. I've asked **MARTHA TIERNEY, WALTER HONEYCUTT, MICHAEL UPCHURCH, AND KARLOS FINLEY** to study the issue and come up with recommendations.

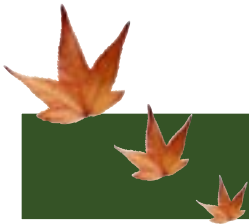

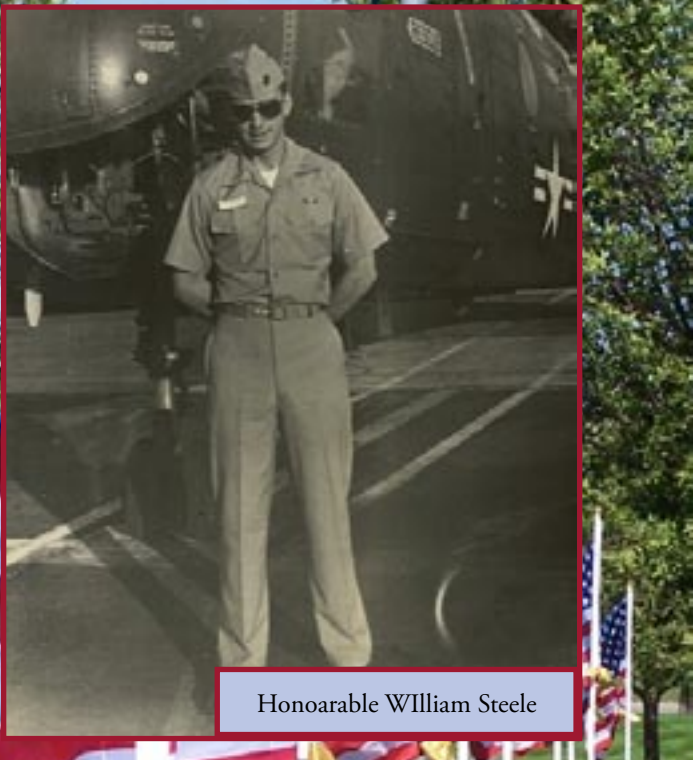

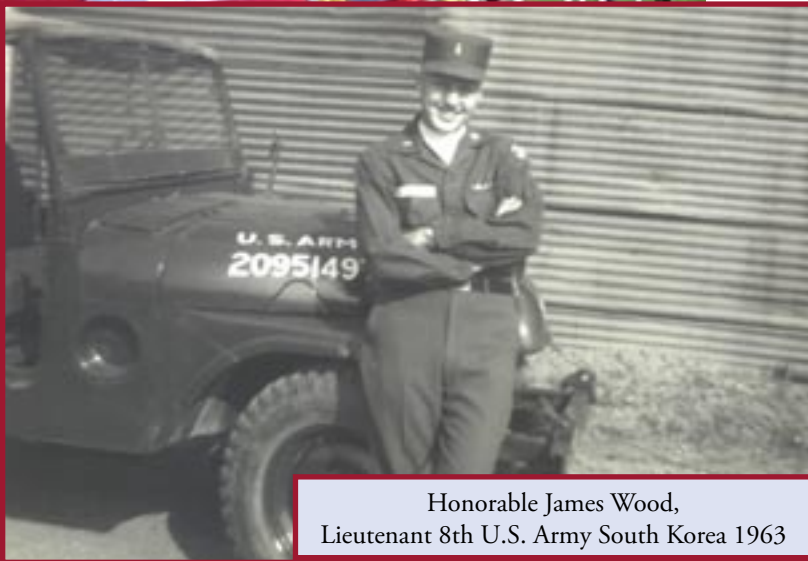
