Human Trafficking

Roane County United Way Invited Senator Corker's Office to Speak on Issue.

The Roane County United Way invited Jane Jolley, Field Director for U.S. Senator Bob Corker office to speak on the issue of human trafficking, how this issue effects Roane County and the End Modern Day Slavery Initiative.

Mrs. Jolley, a West Tennessee native, has been working with Senator Corker's office since 2007. She transitioned into the Knoxville region where she covers 15 East Tennessee Counties including the Oak Ridge Area with Y-12 and Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

While U.S. government agencies and many groups and organizations have taken steps to bring awareness of this social/criminal issue to the forefront, more needs to be done.

"There are 27 million cases of enslaved individuals in the modern slave trade industry." Mrs. Jolley explained.

She went on to advise that these victims are subjected to physical, sexual and mental abuse. They may exhibit behaviors such as physical bruises, vagueness concerning whereabouts and/or become defensive in response to questions or concerns.

Because of our proximity to I-75 and I-40 Corridor, we could see a substantial amount of trafficking cases. Recently, Tennessee Bureau of Investigations released a report that showed 26-100 cases of human trafficking had been reported in Roane County and over 100 in Knox Co. Those that come from poverish backgrounds are more likely to be enslaved.

Sen. Corker has been instrumental in getting legislation passed to help improve enforcement against this crime in the U.S. Legislation has passed the Foreign Relations Committee to establish the "End of Modern Slavery Initiative Foundation", where 80% of the funds will come through matching funds from the private sector and foreign governments and 20% U.S. funds.
