Sexual Orientation Terms

<u>Sexual Orientation</u>- a term frequently used to describe a person's innate romantic, emotional, or sexual attraction to another person. Use the term sexual orientation instead of "sexual preference," "lifestyle," or other terms that denote choice.

<u>Lesbian</u> - a woman who is romantically/sexually attracted to other women.

<u>Gay man</u> – a man who is romantically/sexually attracted to other men.

<u>Bisexual</u> – a person who is romantically/sexually attracted to both sexes.

<u>Pansexual</u> – a person who is romantically/sexually interested in other people regardless of gender, but do not wish to identify as bisexual because it implies that there are only two binary genders or sexes.

<u>Queer</u> –includes individuals who transcend labels of sexual orientation or gender identity. Can also be an umbrella term that refers to the entire LGBTQ community. (Still considered derogatory by older and non-metropolitan people)

MSM – Men who have sex with Men (may not identify as gay)

WSW – Women who have sex with Women (may not identify as a lesbian)

Gender Identity Terms

Birth Sex - the gender assigned at birth based on appearance of genitalia and chromosomes

<u>Gender Identity</u> – a persons deeply felt sense of being male, female, something other, or, in between. Everyone has a gender identity

<u>Gender Expression</u>- an individual's characteristics and behaviors, such as appearance, dress, mannerisms, speech patterns and social interaction

<u>Transgender</u>- An umbrella term used to describe all kinds of people who sit outside the gender binary or whose gender identity is different from the sex assigned to them at birth

<u>Transsexual</u> – an individual who considers them self a member of the opposite sex and who, by surgery or therapy, acquire the physical characteristics of the opposite sex

<u>Transvestite</u> – derogatory term form an individual who dresses in clothing most often associated with the opposite sex for fetish or arousal purposes (this is not synonymous with drag queens)

<u>Transphobia</u> – fear of people who cannot be placed easily in either 'male' or 'female'; includes violence, harassment, and discrimination

<u>Drag</u> – Refers to theatrical performances of gender, Includes drag kings and drag queens

<u>Cross Dresser-</u> A person who has an emotional need to express their alternative gender identity and be accepted in that role on a less permanent basis

<u>Transition or Transitioning-</u> Consists of a change in style of dress, selection of new name, and a request that people use the correct pronoun. This may or may not include necessary medical care like hormone therapy, counseling, and/or surgery

F to M /"Trans Man" - a Biological female who is or has transitioned to male

M to F /"Trans Woman" - a Biological male who is or has transitioned to female

SRS – Sexual Reassignment Surgery; Top = chest area Bottom = genital area

<u>Intersex</u> – a person who has ambiguous genitalia or born with both male and female genitalia and/or DNA (although historically used, the term hermaphrodite is no longer considered an appropriate term and is derogatory)

<u>Cisgender</u> - someone who is comfortable in the gender they were assigned at birth (this term is more appropriate than "normal" or "typical")

<u>Gender-queer</u>- refers to people who do not identify or express themselves as completely male or female. Gender-queer people may or may not identify as transgender

Transgender Etiquette

- It is derogatory to use the terms "transvestite", "tranny", "He-She", "She-Male", or "It"
- It is derogatory to use the term "transgendered"; this is who they always were, not what "happened" to them
- Unless you are a medical professional or in an extremely close relationship with the individual, it is rude to ask:
 - o what reassignment surgeries they've had or plan to have
 - what genitalia they have currently
 - o about their former first name
- If you are unsure of a client's gender, nicely and sincerely ask, "I want to make sure you are completely respected during our talk, what gender pronouns would you prefer I use?"
- A transgender woman is not the same as a drag queen and vice versa.

Phrases/Terms to Know

<u>In-the-Closet</u> – term used to often describe someone who is not open about their sexual orientation or gender identity; It is of the utmost importance to maintain confidentiality if the individual does not wish for others to know <u>Coming out</u> – process a person goes through as they disclose their sexual orientation and/or gender identity to others

<u>Homophobia</u> - dislike, hatred, or fear of homosexuality or persons who identify as homosexuals (can be internal and external)

<u>Transphobia</u> - dislike, hatred, or fear of gender variance or persons who identify as gender variant (can be internal and external)

<u>Heterosexism</u> – The perception that heterosexuality is superior to homosexuality and often involves prejudice and discrimination

<u>Biphobia</u> – term used to describe aversion felt toward bisexuality and bisexuals as a social group or as individuals. A source of discrimination against bisexuals, biphobia is based on negative bisexual stereotypes. Exists in heterosexual and homosexual communities.
