

Jerry began volunteering with Buddy-to-Buddy in February 2014 and has been positively impacting the lives of soldiers at the Big Rapids Armory, Camp Grayling, and now at the Howell Armory after recently relocating to Southeast Michigan.

Jerry earned the trust of the soldiers he worked with at the Big Rapids Armory and is now beginning to establish the same types of relationships with those in his units at Howell, the 1462 TRANS CO and 156 SIG CO. Due to his easygoing and approachable presence in his units and in the community, Jerry has been a able to assist individuals with issues ranging from substance abuse and mental health to employment and benefits. He recently represented Buddy-to-Buddy at a Veterans Day event at Concordia University in Ann Arbor.

Beginning in May 1969, Jerry served in the Air Force for two years, including a year in Vietnam where he was assigned to MACV as an English Language Instructor for the VNAF.
