DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic Violence (DV) comes in many forms and can occur just once or many times. It can happen to anyone.

Children who live with DV in their homes often develop emotional and behavioral problems even if they are never physically abused.

Signs of an Abusive Relationship

Your spouse or intimate partner:

- Calls you names, swears at you to make you feel bad or humiliates you
- Physically hurts you or threatens to hurt you, your family, friends or pets
- Withholds money for basic needs
- Threatens you, hides your legal documents
- Isolates you from family, friends and community
- Threatens to abuse your children
- Constantly checks on you
- Forces you to have sex
- Destroys your belongings
- Stalks and intimidates you
- Exhibits excessive jealousy

SAFETY PLAN

Be prepared/ have a safety plan for yourself and your children

- If you are in immediate danger or are injured, call 911 as soon as possible, the operator will dispatch help immediately.
- Educate your children. Inform them of your safety plan so that they can contact police or neighbors in an emergency.
- When in a confrontation stay away from kitchen and bathrooms.
- Keep a packed bag with spare house keys, car keys, money and basic necessities needed for you and your children.
- Keep important documents in a safe place:
 - State identification card/driver's license
 - Social security card(s)
 - Green card(s)/passport(s)
 - Marriage certificate
 - Car registration
 - Children's immunization records
 - School records
 - Copy of the abuser's social security card
 - Copy of the abuser's birth certificate or proof of date of birth.
