Learning Across New Dimensions in Science is an intensive educational outreach program that strives to facilitate natural resource literacy within schools by creating tangible relationships between the outdoors and essential academic skills.

L.A.N.D.S. Intensive is not only a TEKS aligned program taught in the classroom, it is also hands-on learning experience that allows students to learn about wildlife, conservation, Texas natural resources, and the importance of being a good land steward. Whether doing an activity at school or on a private ranch nearby, students have a unique opportunity to observe, touch, smell, and feel what they are studying. They also get the chance to visit with local professionals in various fields as many times they serve as instructors and mentors. (Aligned TEKS: Science, Math, History, Language Arts, Agriculture Ed., and P.E.)
