The Associate Chair of Educational Strategy and Program Development will be an integral part of building the department into a nationally-recognized center for educating and training the next generation of surgeons in innovative, value-based care delivery.

This is an exciting and unique opportunity to be a contributing member towards building a world-class department from the ground up. We are seeking candidates with a substantial record of leadership and achievement in academic medicine, and significant experience with educational and training programs in surgery. Applicants for this position should possess a medical doctorate or doctor of osteopathy degree from an accredited medical school, be board certified in their respective specialty and subspecialty (if applicable), eligible for appointment as tenure-track faculty, eligible for a Texas medical license, and have experience with value-based care delivery and integrated practice models. Candidates that are not clinicians, but who possess a PhD, along with sufficient experience in surgical education, as well as value-based care delivery and integrated practice models are also encouraged to apply.
