The Chair must demonstrate the ability to effectively steward department resources; understand, appreciate, and guide the development of training and research programs; establish productive working relationships with university administrators, faculty, staff, students, and alumni; effectively support the

distinct academic and clinical partnerships; and be able to represent the department and medical school in the various regional and national communities.

Above all, the chair should work in concert with the dean of the medical school, demonstrating the highest level of personal and professional commitment, enthusiasm, integrity, and support of the medical school and its mission, vision, and values. He/she will align the department with all aspects of the medical school, and strive to achieve excellence in all aspects of department operations.
