

Senior Academic Chair – Primary Care Division/Chair, Department of Family Medicine, Charlotte, North Carolina

The Senior Academic Chair – Primary Care Division/Chair, Department of Family Medicine will work in partnership with the Senior Medical Director of the Primary Care Division of the **Carolinas HealthCare System** (CHS) Medical Group to integrate educational, clinical, research, professional development and community service functions of the Care Division including the training of residents, fellows, medical students, ACP fellows and students and other health professionals. The Senior Academic Chair will promote collaboration across Care Divisions and encourage cross-discipline improvements in patient care, education, and research. The Senior Academic Chair reports to the Chief Academic Officer, and will assist the Chief Academic Officer to accomplish the goals and overall mission of CHS. This includes supervision of the Academic Chairs within the Care Division. In the Primary Care Division this includes the Academic Chairs of Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics and Neurology.

CHS is one of the largest public, not-for-profit healthcare systems in the nation, with 40 affiliated hospitals, 7,500 licensed beds, over 1,900 employed physicians and 60,000 employees. It is an award winning health system and is nationally recognized as a leader in quality of care and delivery of service at over 900 care locations and 10 million patient encounters in North Carolina and South Carolina.

Carolinas HealthCare System has partnered with the [University of North Carolina School of Medicine](#) to designate Carolinas Medical Center (CMC) as the university's Charlotte, N.C. campus. This partnership emphasizes the mission of CHS, which is to provide comprehensive healthcare services and serve the people of North Carolina through leadership in medical education and research. CMC is one of only five teaching hospitals in North Carolina.

Candidate qualifications include graduation from an accredited medical school with MD or DO degree; Completion of a ACGME accredited residency and Board Certification in family medicine; Experience in development and implementation of effective and innovative educational programs for fellows, residents, students, ACs and other health professionals; Demonstrated track record of fostering a robust research environment; Ability to obtain a North Carolina medicine license and to become credentialed with admitting privileges.
