Candidates should have a track record of fiscal responsibility, strong communication skills, clinical operation knowledge and record of student advisement. In addition it will be expected candidates will have a national and international reputation in the field. Candidates will have a doctorate degree (Ph.D. or Ed.D) and associated credentials in a field appropriate to providing academic leadership for the Department. In addition, acceptable candidates will have credentials that merit appointment as Associate Professor or Professor, possess a demonstrated commitment to innovation, and have the leadership skills necessary for guiding faculty development and advancement within research, academic and clinical missions. As a department leader, the Chairperson will provide an energetic and inventive vision for maintaining and growing educational and research programs, developing strategic interdisciplinary teams for furthering research within and across the medical center, and promote continuing faculty development.
