- Excellent interpersonal and oral/written communications skills
- Excellent teambuilding skills
- Demonstrated experience promoting diversity

Desirable Qualifications:

- Experience with accreditation and reporting processes for LCME, ACCME or ACGME
- Experience with predoctoral and postdoctoral education
- Demonstrated ability to obtain education grant funding as a principal investigator
- Demonstrated ability to recruit and retain high quality educators and staff
- Demonstrated experience in successfully infusing diversity and cultural competency into medical and biomedical education
- Experience with education outcomes research
- Experience with budget management

The College of Medicine is currently ranked 11th among all public medical schools and 28th among all medical schools by US News and World Report.
