

## Seeking a Vice President for Health Sciences at Idaho State University

The **Vice President for Health Sciences** will be charged with helping to improve rural healthcare by continuing to enhance and expand ISU's programs and opportunities for interdisciplinary teaching and research, as well as enhancing partnerships with statewide health services providers across the state. The Vice President for Health Sciences will provide academic and executive leadership for health related programs and operations across all campuses of the University and will serve as the chief health affairs officer in the leadership and oversight of all health-related services to faculty, staff, and students. The Division employs 150 faculty and 150 staff.

### Key Responsibilities:

The Vice President reports to the University President. The VP directly supervises all Deans, Department Chairs, Program Directors and related staff within the Division of Health Sciences.

- Lead short-term and long-term strategic planning for health programs, including related reporting to the Idaho State Board of Education. Ensure that future academic and clinic offerings meet the growing needs of the university community and State of Idaho.
- Enhance healthcare related interdisciplinary teaching and research.
- Grow the research profile in the health arena, providing the necessary atmosphere and resources for related faculty to expand their scholarly activity; establish the necessary operations and activities on campus to accelerate research that enhances outcomes and innovation in health care practices across the DHS, University, and Clinics.
- Assess university clinic operations and current physical plant limitations across campuses; provide a vision and plan for clinic facilities that allow for the most effective and efficient delivery of services.
- Develop and maintain strong external relationships with philanthropic organizations, granting agencies and health care organizations that will ensure opportunities for continued growth and development within the Division.
- Lead improved collaboration between DHS clinic operations, academic programs, and university health-related student services such as the University Health Center and Student Counseling operations.
- Provide leadership and oversight for all accreditation efforts within the DHS which involves the ongoing monitoring and activities with over twenty separate accrediting bodies.
- Establish an environment that ensures that all current and future clinic operations are compliant with relevant federal regulations and best business practices.
- Elevate the marketing of DHS clinical services and academic programs to ensure continued growth of clinical services to local communities, added financial stability to clinical and DHS operations, and additional student/resident educational experiences.

- M.D. or Ph.D. with ten years of related experience which includes senior level administration and leadership of academic, clinical and/or research activity in health sciences. Preference may be shown to candidates who hold both an M.D. and Ph.D.

- Ability to generate respect and trust from the university community as well as with stakeholders and leaders in government and healthcare.

**About the Division of Health Sciences:**

In the mid 1980's Idaho State University (ISU) was designated as the lead higher education institution for the health professions by the State Board of Education. Since that time, ISU has grown its health-related programs on its four campuses as well as online. In 2010, the Division of Health Sciences (DHS) was developed and it has continued to increase the University's profile and visibility on-campus and statewide. Today, ISU offers over 30 degree programs ranging from associate and certificate programs in vocational areas to doctoral degrees and post-doctoral residencies. Approximately one third of ISU's graduates each year graduate with health related degrees and certificates.

ISU's role in the state health arena is unique. In addition to its health related educational programs and research, the University has developed health care clinics that serve as training grounds for students and residents, but also as service providers to the general public. ISU offers clinical services to rural populations in oral health, mental health, rehabilitation, primary care, and wellness. ISU recently opened a pharmacy equipped with a tele-pharmacy system that enables it to meet the needs of remote rural communities' state wide.

The Division of Health Sciences is made up of the College of Pharmacy; Schools of Nursing, Health Professions and Communication and Rehabilitation Sciences; and the Office of Medical and Oral Health which houses the Physician Assistant Studies and Dental Hygiene Programs, IDEP, the Idaho Advanced General Dental Residency, and the Family Medicine Residency. Several non-academic units are also part of the Division including the Institute of Rural Health and the Idaho Center for Health Research, the grants and contracts arms of the Division. The Division will also lead collaboration and provide leadership to health related services on campus (University Health Center for faculty, staff, and students, and related student Counseling Services for example). The Division will also provide leadership and coordination with other health-related professional-technical programs that reside in colleges and departments outside the Division of Health Sciences.
