

The University of Vermont College of Medicine and the University of Vermont Health Network invite applications and nominations for the position of Chair of the Department of Radiology. This is an outstanding opportunity for an accomplished physician leader to oversee and further develop the clinical, educational, and research programs of this vital department in a dynamic academic medical setting.

The Department of Radiology is an academic practice consisting of more than 30 fellowship-trained radiology physicians, 10 radiation oncologists, and an accomplished cadre of advanced practice providers and physicists providing services in nine radiology sub-specialties and radiation oncology. The department is committed to bringing advanced imaging technology to the local community and beyond, utilizing cutting edge translational research to advance clinical care. Equipment is state-of-the-art with a 3.0 T magnet, two 1.5 T magnets, and a 1.0 T open magnet, as well as top of the line CT scanners, PET and SPECT CT, and breast tomosynthesis. The faculty work collaboratively as multidisciplinary team members within their respective areas of practice both in the clinic and in research endeavors. The group interprets over 350,000 clinical exams per year.

The Diagnostic Radiology residency program, accredited by the ACGME, offers six resident positions annually. ACGME approved fellowships include neuroradiology and vascular interventional radiology. In addition, non-ACGME accredited fellowships are offered in breast imaging, body imaging, chest imaging and MSK.

The department also supports an active clinical research effort and generates significant scholarly activity. The MRI Center, established as a core facility to support research at the College of Medicine and throughout the University, specializes in neuroimaging, including functional MRI. The state-of-the-art 3T MRI scanner is also fully equipped for whole body imaging. Through an established relationship with Philips Healthtec, the Center was the first site in North America to implement MultiTransmit (2009) and dStream (2013), and will be the first to upgrade the spectrometer to support multiband acquisition (2016). The MRI Center supports more than 40 research projects, and recently was nationally recognized as the lead Philips' MRI site of a \$200 million multi-center Adolescent Behavior and Cognitive Development (ABCD) study of 10,000 children over 10 years.

The Chair of the Department of Radiology at the University of Vermont College of Medicine . also serves as the Health Care Service Leader of Radiology for the University of Vermont Medical Center and the University of Vermont Health Network. Together, the College of Medicine, the Medical Center, and the College of Nursing and Health Sciences comprise the only academic medical center in Vermont and northern upstate New York. The medical center has state-of-the-art clinical, research, and education facilities, including an interdisciplinary clinical simulation center.

The University of Vermont Medical Center is committed to providing patients in its catchment area of over 2 million people with the safest, high-quality care possible. In 2014, the Medical Center was ranked first in Patient Safety from the University Health Consortium (UHC). As Health Care Service Leader, the Chair will play a vital role in the continuing development of clinical and physician integration across the University of Vermont Health Network, currently a

five hospital system including the University of Vermont Medical Center in Burlington, VT; Central Vermont Medical Center in Berlin, VT; Champlain Valley Physicians' Hospital in Plattsburgh, NY; Alice Hyde Medical Center in Malone, NY; and Elizabethtown Hospital in Elizabethtown, NY.

The ideal candidate will bring national recognition in education, clinical service, or research, as well as experience in leadership and collaboration, strategic planning and implementation, and financial and resource management of an academic Department of Radiology. Applicants must be a physician, board certified in Radiology, and eligible for Vermont State medical licensure. Candidates are expected to have credentials appropriate for the rank of Professor at the University of Vermont.

The University of Vermont is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the University and excellence of the academic medical center community through their research, teaching, service, leadership, or life experiences. Applicants are requested to describe in their cover letter how they will further the University of Vermont's goal of inclusive excellence.

The University of Vermont College of Medicine, founded in 1882, is the nation's seventh oldest medical school and is widely recognized for innovations in education and research. The University of Vermont is located in Burlington, Vermont, on the shores of Lake Champlain between the Adirondack and Green Mountains.
