The UAB School of Medicine invites applications and nominations for the position of Regional Dean at the Huntsville Regional Medical Campus (HRMC), one of three regional campuses of the UAB School of Medicine. The HRMC is home to the UAB School of Medicine Huntsville Program, which includes one of the premier family medicine residencies in the Southeast, and the UAB Health Center Huntsville, the north Alabama anchor of the UAB Health System with the largest physician practice in the region.

The HRMC provides a community-based clinical education program for junior and senior medical students where physicians and other health professionals throughout north Alabama collaborate with Huntsville campus faculty to plan and teach the undergraduate and resident programs. The HRMC offers a two-year clinical education program for junior and senior medical students, a three-year family medicine residency program, a three-year internal medicine residency program, and continuing medical education conferences to aid practicing physicians and other health professionals in maintaining licensure and certification requirements.

The UAB Health Center Huntsville is the only academic, multi-specialty facility in north Alabama, and is home to 30 faculty physicians providing care in four specialties, including: family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics and psychiatry. In 2003, the UAB Health Center Huntsville moved to a new 93,000 square foot facility that houses both the clinical and educational programs. The Health Center, which was designed to be a "microcosm of a complete primary health care delivery system," averages 60,000 patient encounter each year.

HRMC's primary teaching hospital is the Huntsville Hospital, a 941-bed hospital, which is the second largest in Alabama. Huntsville Hospital serves as the regional referral center for north Alabama and southern Tennessee. In recent years, the hospital expanded its service throughout the area with the development of the Huntsville Hospital Health System, the third largest publicly owned hospital system in the nation with more than 2,000 beds and 12,000 employees.

The Regional Dean is the chief academic and administrative officer of the Huntsville Regional Medical Campus (HRMC) and reports directly to the Dean of the School of Medicine at The University of Alabama at Birmingham. The Regional Dean is responsible for leading the HRMC and defining its standard of excellence, and also serves as President and CEO of The Valley Foundation, the physician practice plan for HRMC. The Regional Dean will be responsible for providing strategic, visionary, and administrative leadership. S/he will represent a discipline of primary care, have an outstanding academic record, a commitment to excellence in professional education and the promotion of research, and the ability to collaborate effectively with university and community partners.

Consideration will be given to tenured, tenure track and non-tenure earning clinical track candidates. Candidates must be board certified and qualified for licensure in Alabama, medical staff privileges at Huntsville Hospital, and credentialing as a physician provider. An MD or DO is required.
