Department of Justice Investigation of the Chicago Police Department



The United States Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division, and the United States Attorney's Office for the Northern District of Illinois have opened a civil pattern or practice investigation into the Chicago Police Department (CPD) to determine whether there are systemic violations of the Constitution or federal law by the CPD. The investigation is focused on: CPD's use of force, including racial, ethnic and other disparities in its

use of force; and CPD's accountability systems, including, how CPD conducts internal investigations, responds to citizen complaints, and handles officer discipline.
