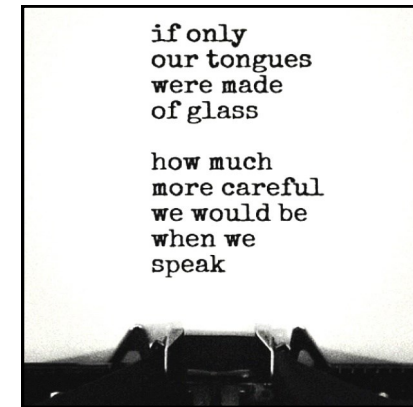

Support Church & Society and VIP with Today's Special Offering



Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could address issues before they became a crisis? By being proactive, we could do a better job of keeping families together rather than waiting for them to fall apart, and we could mitigate the costly reactive crisis management and decade-long impacts on society from broken families. Together, as a church family, we have made and continue to make a difference.

At Paradise Valley United Methodist Church, we recognize that to follow the gospel of Jesus Christ we need to be concerned with real human issues in our church and community. We are called upon to educate ourselves on issues within our congregation and communities, as well as to provide leadership within our faith-based institutions in our democratic society. The PVUMC Church & Society Ministry Team works with other faith-based institutions in the Phoenix Metro area as part of the Valley Interfaith Project or VIP, <http://valleyinterfaithprojectaz.com/> to identify and address common social justice concerns preventing our fellow citizens from achieving their full human potential. Here are some examples:

- **Arizona Career Pathways:** a four-year-old, VIP-sponsored workforce training model and labor market intermediary recognized as the best of its kind in the country with 85%+ graduation rates and 85%+ workforce retention rates. Demonstrated doubling of wages through two-year education and placement in in-demand jobs. People who once needed support now support others.
- **Arizona Medicaid Restoration and Expansion:** On June 30, 2013 VIP supported Governor Brewer and key legislative allies at a gathering of 800 people at PVUMC, encouraging passage of a contentious restoration of voter-backed funding for those in Arizona living below the Federal Poverty Line and expanded coverage up to 133% of the FPL. This effort stabilized the healthcare delivery system in Arizona and made access to the healthcare system possible for thousands of working poor across the state.
- **Human Trafficking:** VIP sponsored a gathering of more than 200 people at PVUMC on September 30, 2013. Police chiefs, law enforcement, Arizona's attorney general, state legislators and educators came together to address the fastest growing and most lucrative crime in the US and the world: trafficking of children for sex. VIP supported the Governor's task force, the Attorney General, and legislative efforts culminating in national model legislation signed into law in May 2014. Through this new law, all children under 17 are treated as unwilling participants needing help, and the men who pay for sex or make money from these children are treated as predators.
