Research on second language acquisition indicates the earlier a child begins to learn a language, the easier they acquire that language. Research also identifies frequency is a critical component in growing a student's language proficiency.

Articulation between all 3 levels (elementary teacher rep, curriculum monitor~middle school, curriculum coordinator~high school) creating a shared vision for World Language at all levels

- bi-weekly meetings
- study and articulation of curriculum
- study of assessments
- joint professional development

- Collaborative discussions and calibration across all levels

- Review/Revision of 5th and/or 6th grade curriculum as result of the elementary world language program
