



Re-dedication in Houghton Lake, Michigan Sunday, October 4, 2015 at 1:00 p.m.

What: 85th Anniversary Re-dedication of the
Louisa St. Clair Chapter DAR Forest

Where: Old 27 approx. 1.5 miles South of Snowbowl Rd

Over 85 years ago the Louisa St. Clair Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) had 104,900 seedlings planted on 220 acres of a 544-acre parcel of land in Houghton Lake -- the first DAR reforestation project in the country. The Forest was named in their honor by the State of Michigan and the Chapter had an impressive granite monument placed on the site and dedicated on October 4th, 1930.

Plan to join DAR, SAR & CAR leadership/members; government dignitaries; active military/veterans; service organizations, educators; conservationists; historians; community youth; and Louisa St. Clair Chapter members as they celebrate this important event in our history.
