Your waste must be at the curb by 6 AM Saturday April 9, 2016

1. No trash carts will be emptied. Scattered trash will not be picked up.
2. Tree waste and brush must be bundled to be picked up by a packer. Bundles need to be tied/secured and should be 4 feet long or under; and no more than 12 inches in diameter. If you take brush to the skids, it does not have to be bundled.
3. Any items put out after 6 AM Saturday may not be picked up. The trucks and volunteers will not backtrack. City will not pick up after the cleanup.
4. Tires must be piled separately, not under other waste. No more than 5 tires per location will be picked up. Do not put out commercial/business tires.
5. If any resident charges another party to leave items on their property for pickup, those items **will not** be picked up and resident must remove them.
6. No concrete –take to C&D landfill. No hazardous chemicals –take to 801 Stillwell facility (paint, pesticides, appliances with Freon, etc.)

Bring your waste to Hoover street. Enter from Douglas, facing north. Come between 8 AM and noon, Saturday, April 9, 2016. You are expected to unload your own waste. (Monetary donations to help OBNA projects will be appreciated.)

Thank you for cleaning up our neighborhood.

We have one designated scrap-per this year. No others will be allowed.

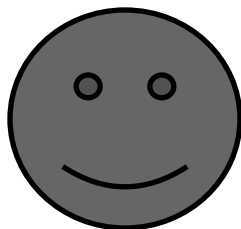

Similarly, establish a storm shelter and practice with your children how to exit your home. Also put water, lanterns, radio, blankets in your shelter. You want them already at the shelter before you go.
