### MINISA SWIMMING POOL- CLOSES IN 2021 FOR MORE PARK SPACE/RIVER LAUNCH SITE

The city has allocated \$18 million to spend on designing and making pool improvements through the end of 2023. In an updated aquatics plan recently presented at a City Council workshop session by the Park and Recreation Department, 5 neighborhood pools are proposed to be closed. From 2019 to 2023, pools at Boston Park, Linwood Park, McAdams, and Orchard Park would be demolished and replaced with water playgrounds (splash pads) which may combine large fountains, slides and jungle gyms. Pools at Evergreen, Alley and Edgemoor would receive significant improvements. College Hill and Harvest pools would get improvements if money was available at the end of the wave of capital projects.

Minisa pool would be demolished and converted into park space or a recreation area tied to the Little Arkansas River in 2021. As several city council members noted, this leaves the neighborhoods in the city center without convenient access to a city swimming facility. Continued on page 2.



Some of us are concerned that these are also the neighborhoods that need these amenities the most for water safety training, swim lessons, and the exercise a swim pool can provide. Plans are for Minisa to be gaining more park land and a river dock facility. (Yes, we have a dock at North High and another just north of 18th-both need upgrades).

#### Fresh Air Baby Camp, WINTER UPDATES

Work on the restoration of the Fresh Air Baby Camp/Girl Scout Little House continues, thanks to the work of many volunteers and support of local professionals and businesses.

- \*We received the warranty for the roofing tile from Ludowici.
- \*Final city inspection for the roof and support structure and all building plans have been approved.
- \*IES- The Illuminating Engineering Society has donated \$500 toward purchase of LED lighting fixtures, which have been ordered with the help of Accent Lighting.
- \*Westar completed a design plan for a new electric pole at the East edge of the park. Thanks to Shane Price of Westar, David McQuire, Warren and Jason and others from city park maintenance, and volunteer electrician, Arnold Ozols, the trenching and installation of underground electric service has been completed. Mr. Ozols is working to bring the electric cable into the building and Westar will be installing a new pole, transformer and meter soon.
- \*Jayne Sanders is almost finished re-construction of our transom windows, which will be replaced over the doors.
- \*Thanks to volunteers from the Catacombs Youth Ministry, and Steve Jacobs, our triple-hung windows and supplies have been moved to a new location and are ready for restoration to be completed.

# **CROWDFUNDING FOR NEW** KANSAS WILDLIFE EXHIBIT **SIGNAGE**

The Wichita Parks Foundation (WPF) a volunteer-led 501(c)3, and the volunteers with the Friends of the Kansas Wildlife Exhibit, have begun an online crowdfunding campaign to raise money for new educational signage at our "Little Zoo" in Riverside Park.

# Wichita's Veterans' Memorial Park

Just west of 2nd and Waco, this park is one of the best veteran's parks in the U.S. Visitors from other states tell us this! The park is constantly changing with new memorials

and upgrades to its walkways and grounds.

The current memorial being established is the Revolutionary War Memorial, located near the head of the park (east end) and close to the Flag Pavilion. Without this War, the United States of American would *not* be as it is today.

To date the base for the centerpiece is set, capstone has been placed on the surround wall, the bas' relief has been designed, salt-fired and placed on the wall, and 8'x8" tiles already ordered are being etched for placement on the wall. There are many more tiles available for a donation of \$100. Each tile has about 7 lines to be etched commemorating any of the following: family member involved in the War as military or volunteer, skirmish, bridge, etc. Any thing or anyone who assisted in any way can be honored, and the name of the honoree can also be placed on the tile.

# **Street Safety: For Driving & Bicycling in Wichita**For People Driving

**THE DOOR ZONE** When opening your car door, you are required to make sure that it is safe to do so and that it can be done without interfering with the movement of other traffic, including people bicycling.

THREE-FOOT LAW People driving are required by law to pass people bicycling with a clearance of at least 3-feet. BIKE LANES A pavement line and bike lane symbol (bicycle with single arrow) indicate that the portion of the roadway has been designated for preferential or exclusive use of people bicycling. People are not allowed to park motor vehicles in the bike lanes. In some locations bike lanes have been painted green to increase awareness and visibility of the bike lane.

Solid Bike Lane Line When the bike lane is marked with solid lane lines, then motor vehicles should only travel through the bike lane when accessing a driveway or parking space. When the bike lane at the intersection is a solid lane line, then motor vehicles should make a right turn from the travel lane to the left of the bike lane. People driving should be aware of their surroundings, look for people in the bike lane, and yield to people bicycling straight through the intersection.

**Dashed Bike Lane Line** When the bike lane is a dashed line, then motor vehicles can transition through the bike lane to access a designated right turn lane.

Shared Lane Markings Shared lane markings (sharrows) are pavement marking symbols that indicate an appropriate bicycle positioning in a shared travel lane. They are carefully placed to guide bicyclists to the best place to ride on the road, avoid car doors and remind drivers to share the road with cyclists. Unlike bicycle lanes, sharrows do not designate a particular part of the street for the exclusive use of bicyclists. They are simply a marking to guide bicyclists to the best place to ride and help communicate to motorists that they should expect bicyclists on the roadway. In some locations sharrows have been installed with green paint underneath. The green paint is used to increase visibility and awareness of the sharrow.


