1. BRITISH COLUMBIA

- Lowest number of nurses per capita
- Lowest cancer mortality rate in Canada

2. ALBERTA

- Above average access to a doctor
- Longer than average wait times to see a specialist

3. SASKATCHEWAN

- Most effective at meeting wait time standards for hip replacement surgery
- Highest percentage of patients re-admitted to a hospital within one month

4. MANITOBA

- All patients receive cancer treatment within medically recommended wait times
- Most long-term residential care beds per capita

5. ONTARIO

- Fewest number of hospital beds per capita
- Most people reporting having a regular medical doctor

6. QUEBEC

- Lowest number of deaths in hospital
- Least expensive hospital stay

7. NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

- Long-term residential care is publically funded
- Most effective at meeting wait time standards for knee replacement surgery

8. NEW BRUNSWICK

- Largest number of people on wait list to see a specialist
- Fewest number of residential long-term care beds per capita

9. NOVA SCOTIA

- Highest number of doctors per capita
- 12% of patients do not receive cancer treatment within medically recommended wait times

10. PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

- Greatest number of hospital beds per capita
- Least effective in meeting wait time standards for cataract surgery

11. YUKON

- Most expensive hospital stay
- 59% of all Yukoners with a hip fracture have to travel to BC or Alberta for surgery

12. NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

- 42% of the population have a regular doctor
- Highest percentage of return visit to a hospital for mental health services

13. NUNAVUT

- Smallest percentage of people who report that they have a regular medical doctor
- Cost of hospital stay far above average
