- b. Complete all written and coaching triad assignments.

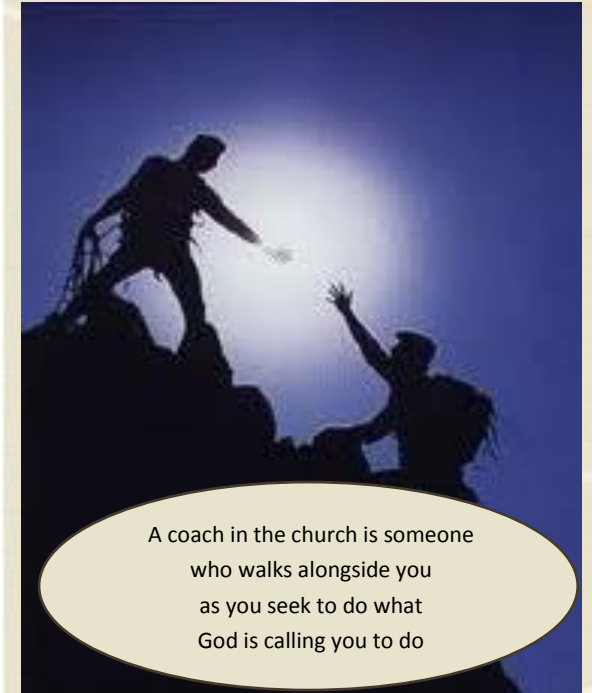
### Field Work

- b. Labs under development include: Coaching Mission Developers, Coaching Mission Redevelopers, Stewardship and Discipleship.


## ELCA Coach Launch North Carolina Synod

## What is a Coach?

A Coach is someone who comes alongside to help you discover what God wants you to do, and then do it. A coach helps you answer three basic questions: Where am I? Where do I believe God wants me to go? How will I get there? What is my first step?

A coach is an encourager who can help you live into the vision God has for you. Equipped with good listening skills and powerful questions, a coach can help leaders move beyond stuck points in ministries and envision creative ways to accomplish God's purposes in the church and the world.

A coach is not a counselor, giving advice. A coach is not a consultant, telling you what to do next. A coach is someone who helps you be all that God wants you to be.
