The RAM 6th Annual International PEEPS Art Exhibition is HERE

Racine, WI March 24, 2015

On Friday, March 27, within the pristine white walls of a contemporary art museum, the Racine Art Museum presents an untraditional exhibition showcasing fluffy, sugar-coated marshmallow PEEPS®. The museum welcomes 88 entries that demonstrate the talent of over 104 artists.

Each year, the show's popularity draws over 3,000 visitors to the museum during its three-week run, setting daily attendance records along the way. This spring, visitors will discover creations such as *PEEPerweight* featuring a hand-blown glass PEEP, *Peepwee Herman's Playhouse*, and an entry from a local Racine business entitled *Lakeview Pharmacy Peepscription*.

All entries will be judged later this week by a panel of experts, based on creativity and best use or representation of PEEPS®. Prizes will be awarded in both adult and children's categories and announced Thursday night during the Artist Reception and Awards Ceremony. In addition, one lucky artist will take home the coveted PEEPles Choice Award where the community votes for their favorite creation.

Enjoy FREE admission during First Friday in Downtown Racine on April 3, from 10:00 am to 9:00 pm. No Free Family Hands-On Art Activity will be offered.
