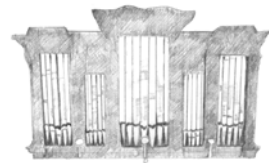

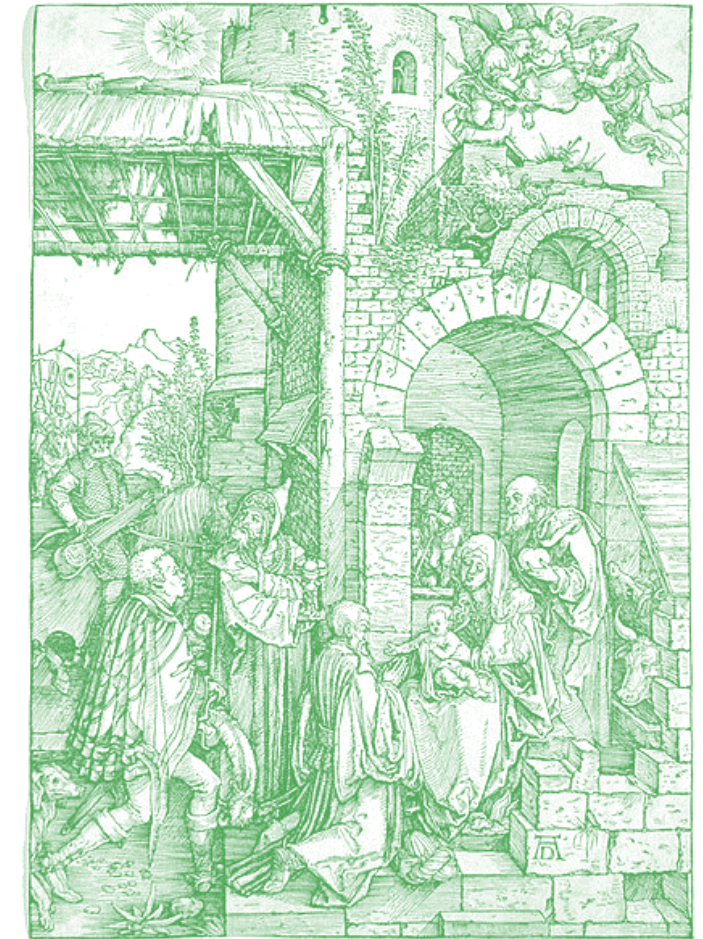
THE CATHEDRAL MISSION STATEMENT
