## **Conference Location**

The 2016 Innovative Educator Conference will be held in the Morgan University Center on the campus of Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, Tennessee. Located just 53 miles northwest of Nashville, Clarksville and Austin Peay are easily accessible from all directions via major interstate highways. Clarksville is served by the Nashville Metropolitan Airport.

## **Developing Your Presentation**

The design of your presentation should encourage involvement of the audience using participant exercises, problem-solving exercises, and group work wherever appropriate. Presentations should focus on the "why" and the "how" educators should implement these emerging trends. Concurrent sessions should be 50 minutes long. Workshops should be 2 hours long. Proposals will be evaluated and selected based on the following criteria:

- · Complete description and quality of content
- · Adherence to the theme of the conference
- · Application of content to practice
- · Potential engagement of the audience
