Madison Meadows Middle School won the National Blue Ribbon Award in 2015. During a ceremony on Tuesday, November 10th, Amy Bondeson, Dr. Kellis, and I accepted the award on behalf of Madison Meadows at a ceremony in Washington, D.C. This is a huge honor for Meadows, and I am pleased to be a part of it. That is what I am — a part of it. I am so proud of the teachers and staff that make a difference in the lives of our students every day. Their education and preparation, their efforts, their willingness to go the extra mile to support and enhance student learning are the key ingredients. Teachers are the main reason Madison Meadows is being recognized.

However, there are others who made this award possible for our school. Dr. Tim Ham was the Superintendent of Schools for the Madison School District from 2007 until the summer of 2014. In his seven years at the helm of the district, he implemented programs and practices that increased the effectiveness and supported the strengths of Madison administrators, teachers, and staff. We became a Professional Learning Community adept at implementing Response to Intervention, and Positive Behavior Interventions and Support. With his guidance we created a more effective lesson plan template to ensure that teachers were able to provide students with first, best instruction. He implemented a coaching model so that all of us — administrators, teachers, and students could all get better, be better.

Todd Stevens and Laura Webb, former Meadows assistant principals made significant contributions to our winning this award. Mr. Stevens began the process of digging deep into data to look at the effectiveness of our practices and using that same data to guide instruction and Guided Study. Mrs. Webb continued that practice and brought the newer teachers on board. Together they ensured that teachers had the tools and abilities to disaggregate the data themselves to increase student growth and achievement. In their collective five years here, they set the tone for data driven decision making.

Supportive parents are hugely impactful to Meadows being recognized. You are your child's first teachers and set the tone for success in school. The support you provide our teachers and their practices cannot go unnoticed. We value the partnership we share in educating your children. Our governing board and current superintendent, Dr. Quinn Kellis have extended their support as well. They provide us with the autonomy to do what we do best: provide students with high levels of learning in a rigorous — yet supportive — environment. We appreciate their unflagging support.

Finally, our students – past and present – make the difference at Meadows. We are fortunate to have a student body which cares about learning. Our kids want to do well; they strive to do well. Meadows students set and achieve goals. They focus on learning. They care about others. Our students and their passion for learning is another key ingredient to Madison Meadows being chosen as a National Blue Ribbon School in 2015. Congratulations to everyone who worked so hard and so well. You earned this.

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
2015 National Blue Ribbon Schools

U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan recognized 335 schools as National Blue Ribbon Schools for 2015 based on their overall academic excellence or their progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups. These schools demonstrate that all students can achieve to high levels. The schools represent public and non-public elementary, middle and high schools, including traditional, charter, magnet schools, parochial and independent schools in 45 States, and Department of Defense Education Activity schools in Fort Bragg, North Carolina, Germany and Korea. The Department will honor all 285 public and 50 private schools at a recognition ceremony on Nov. 9-10 at the Omni Shoreham Hotel in Washington, D.C. Each school will receive an award plaque and a flag as symbols of their accomplishments. In its 33-year history, more than 8,000 of America's schools have received the coveted National Blue Ribbon Schools award.

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Meadows IB Corner of the World

Hello, Meadows' Parents:

Here is a brief summary of the IB learning in the classroom that is occurring on the Meadows Campus during second quarter!

Our 5th graders are learning about controlling variables in Ms. Vakula's science class. Students are participating in activities from the "Variables" IB Unit. In Mr. Goff's science class, students are wrapping up their learning from the "Solar System" IB Unit.

Our 6th graders are studying various countries in their Language and Literature and Individuals & Societies classes as their teachers implement the interdisciplinary unit "Country Report." The culminating activity from this IB unit will lead into a Festival of Nation's showcase of all student work in mid-December.

Our 7th graders just returned from a fabulous field trip to the Junior Achievement Financial Park. They learned budgeting, debt management, and how to plan for their future. In Ms. Bloom's science class, the students are well into their "National Park" geology project from the IB unit on "National Parks." Students are designing PowerPoint presentations and creating an original promotional item that represents the geology of their park. Classroom presentations will start November 18th!

Our 8th graders in Mr. Samuel's and Ms. Anderson's science classes are studying chemistry through the IB Unit "What's the Matter?" Students recently finished a lab where they figured out the density of water. They will also be participating in future labs involving chemical reactions and measuring pH levels of various materials.

News from IB Headquarters:

The IB website has added a parent page to their site. Information from this site describes the four different IB programs, provides research on the value of the IB programs and lists additional information related to the Diploma Program (DP). The DP is the next program after the Middle Years Program (MYP). This program is available for students to apply for at North High School in the Phoenix Union School District and also at North Canyon High School in the Paradise Valley School District. 




IMMUNIZATIONS: Please remember to send in a copy of ANY shots your child receives so we can update the health record. Meningitis and Tdap are due in the 6th grade. In order to be in school- your child needs these shots. Please call me with any questions.

COLDS/FLU: If your child has diarrhea, vomiting or a temperature, they may not attend school for 24 hours. Please keep your child home if they are sick. If you child has Strep. Throat- they may return to school 24 hours after starting an antibiotic as long as there is no fever. Extra rest, increasing fluids and eating right are 3 simple ways to help ward off illnesses.
