Are you interested in pursuing a doctorate in public policy?

The Ph.D in Public Policy and Administration at the L. Douglas Wilder School of Government and Public Affairs at Virginia Commonwealth University provides advanced training and professional study in your choice of four concentration or specialization areas, with courses that focus on providing a solid foundation in public policy theory, economics, research design and quantitative analysis. Our highly regarded doctoral program prepares students for leadership roles as academicians, researchers, policymakers and practitioners.

The Ph.D program is noted for its highly individualized and interdisciplinary approach. Students may choose from the following concentrations: Criminal Justice Policy, Public Administration, Public Policy and Urban and Regional Policy.

GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS

Each year, the Wilder School awards ten or more teaching and research graduate assistantships to highly qualified applicants for full-time doctoral study. Both nine and 12-month assistantships are available and include a tuition waiver and stipend. Assistantships provide experiences for graduate students to support faculty teaching and research.

Assistantships can be offered for up to three years of full-time doctoral study but are renewable on an annual basis contingent on satisfactory progress and performance. In the 2014-2015 academic year, stipends ranged from \$14,000 for nine month assistantships to \$22,000 for 12-month.
