# A few thoughts from Pastor Feltman

When Del Grosser died suddenly on January 22, many of the tasks that she took care of needed to be picked up. One of the most urgent was organizing the schedule for the new church pictorial directory. Del had been the coordinator for the last three directories and was in the middle of coordinating her fourth. To honor her efforts, the directory company has given us an extra page in the new directory so that we can dedicate it to Del.

I learned over the years that, for Del, the directory is not just a collection of portraits or a convenient way of looking up an address. It is a family album. It is a collection of pictures of folks whose lives matter to one another. It sounds like a trite marketing slogan, but Del believed strongly that the pictorial directory is not complete unless EVERY family is included. Del took it personally when families did not sign up. To her, it just felt like they didn't want to be in the family picture.

In the days after her death, while I was picking up the task of getting families signed up, I began to take it personally, too. I heard lots of reasons why families or individuals did not want to sign up. "My kids are away at college, and we don't want to take a portrait without them." Or, "I'm too old to get a new picture. Let me just send you an old one." As a serious amateur photographer, I was offended when someone suggested that professional photographs were a waste of time. "Why don't we just have every one take a picture on their cell phone and send it in?"

I will never mean as much to Epiphany as Del did, but, at least on this one project, I'm going to take up her cause. Won't you make an effort to get photographed for our new pictorial directory? Not so that the company can make money, or that you'll have a "professional" portrait of the family, or that we can brag about how big our church is. Would you sign up to have your portrait included so that our family portrait will be complete?

If we get everyone, I bet we'll get a smile from Del from heaven!

## A Tale of Two Crosses

The two large crosses in the chancel area during Lent and Easter have an interesting story to tell:

In August of 1963 Pastor Robert Hooker came to Epiphany from a church in Wookstock, Illinois bringing us the concept of the two crosses. From a photograph and a sketch of the "Living Cross" as it had been made by his church choir in Woodstock, Altar Guild members assisted by Epiphany men devised a "Rugged Cross" for Lent 1964 using the 1963 Christmas tree. The Christmas tree symbolizes the birth of Christ and its transformation into a cross reminds us of Christ's death. The purple drape speaks of royalty - Christ the King. The crown of thorns symbolizes Christ's suffering,

humiliation, and death.

Similarly, the 1964 Christmas tree was fashioned into a cross which became our first "Living Cross" for Easter 1965. This cross was wrapped in chicken wire and stuffed with moss. It is soaked in water for several days. Flowers and greenery are added by Altar Guild members. Our "Living Cross" reminds us of Christ's birth, death, and resurrection. The white lilies symbolize Christ's purity, His resurrection, and His promise of hope and eternal life.



Easter 2016 will mark the 51st anniversary of our "Living Cross" which is a focal point in the chancel area on Easter morning. Members of Altar Guild use approximately 150 lily heads, several bunches of baby's breath, and bundles of leather leaf to assemble the display. The generous donations of Epiphany members and friends have made it possible to carry on this tradition for fifty years.

Altar Guild has willing hearts and hands but needs monetary support for our efforts. If you can make a donation to help purchase supplies for the cross this year, please use a pew envelope and mark it LIVING CROSS.

## **First Communion Preparation**



As part of the Journey of Faith we will be holding classes in preparation for First Communion on:

Wednesday, March 9, 2016 at 6:30 p.m.

You need attend only one class.

Young people who wish to begin communing may attend this class. *Parent(s)* need to attend with their young person. These children will be welcomed to the table in worship on Palm Sunday, March 20, 2016.

Younger children may also receive instruction, but please speak first with one of the pastors.

Here are answers to some frequently asked questions:

## What is the "right age" for my child to have communion?

Holy Communion is one of the two sacraments we celebrate in the Lutheran church. The statement from the church outlines that since 1969 congregations have continued to lower the age of communion. Traditionally, at Epiphany Lutheran, we've instructed children who are in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade (or older) in receiving this sacrament. However, the time is best determined through mutual conversation that includes, parent(s), child, and pastor. The age at which your child should receive communion has nothing to do with how much they "know," but rather how ready they are to respond to the gift of Christ in the Supper. If you have questions as to whether your child is ready to commune, please speak to Pastor Ron or Pastor Jennifer and together we will help to discern the best for your family.

Can I elect to have my child wait? Can I have my child commune early? Yes and Maybe! If you wish to defer First Communion for your child, you may choose to do so. If you have a younger child who wishes to commune, please speak with Pastor Ron or Pastor Jennifer.




## **Epiphany Players**

Was Peter crucified upside-down? Was James Mary's son? Was John a martyr? Local author and professor Bryan Litfin wrote After Acts: Exploring the Lives and Legends of the Apostles as a summary of findings regarding the most common questions in patristics, the study of early Christianity. There were not security cameras on every block and a blog from every home in the first and second centuries, so there is a lack of what modern courts would consider incontrovertible evidence; however, Dr. Litfin's gut is well-informed, and he carefully explains the parameters of his research and the definitions of his terms. He handles the topic with reverence and tries to direct readers to the important known impact of each of his subjects. Any reader with a detailed familiarity of the characters in the New Testament should find new information in this informative, short book. ## **View From The Pew**

Del Grosser

Del's son, Jeff Grosser, has written his thoughts about his mother, Del, and shares them in her space here.

The world for the Grosser family changed irrevocably on Friday, January 22 when our matriarch, Del, passed from this world to the next.

I would daresay this is as much a blow to the community of Epiphany as it is to our immediate family. As much as we know how much she cared for each of us, the community of Elmhurst and Epiphany specifically was her home. The happenings of the church and the people who inhabited it were her life's passion and work. A few years ago, when it was time to move out of the family home, it made sense to some of us "kids" that she find a place to live with or near one of us. She would have none of that. Her life was in Elmhurst and that was where she would stay.

The response to grief and death of a loved one is difficult to predict. For me, my mother's wake at Ahlgrim's was perhaps a perfect scenario for the end of her life. The five-plus hours my siblings and I stood receiving the folks who had been so important in Mom's life went by in an instant. I realize it's a commitment in time and endurance to wait in a line like that, in some cases to offer condolences to people you hardly know, but it was clear many people had things to share. The stories we heard were amazing and inspiring even to us who knew her well. Who would send a card to a person in the hospital every day for a month! Who would visit another person in a nursing home every week for over seven years? Her life was made up of stories like these, told by the very people who had been the recipients or witnesses to that incredible tenacity. To paraphrase Janet Rudman's wonderful observation, perhaps's Del's swift and painless passing was a reward from God for her efforts and time serving those who were not so fortunate!
