Papers must comply with the following guidelines:

- **Length:** 800 - 1000 words
- **Format:** Papers must be submitted electronically in Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) format
- **Conditions:** Submissions must be original and may not have been published previously or be under consideration for publication while being evaluated for this conference.
