PARENTS/GUARDIANS AND STUDENTS:

Pinnacle and Credits: Track academic progress online and credits. See guidance with questions.

Big Brother/Big Sister: Consider becoming a Big Brother/Big Sister next year. See Guidance for more information.

Online Courses - If you are working on an online course, be sure you are keeping up and working diligently to complete it so that you are on track for graduation.

Attendance: Keep track of attendance and be sure not to exceed the limits.

SENIORS

Credit Checks: Make sure you have the credits you need to graduate. See your Counselor if you anticipate a loss of credit due to class failure or attendance.

Naviance: Continue to update your college information including your acceptances and the school you will be attending.

JUNIORS:

College Lab & Naviance: Get a head start on post-high school planning. Sign onto Naviance to review results of interest inventory or start your search for colleges. See your counselor for logon information or if you have any questions.

Visits: You should be visiting post-secondary programs, schools, and college to get a head start. Spend time thinking about what you would like to do after high school. Over the summer, talk to friends and family about their education and career paths.

NCAA Clearinghouse: All Juniors who may want to participate in Divisional college sports must register through the NCAA Eligibility center, www.eligibilitycenter.org. There is a cost to register. See Vicki Parady-Guay, Athletic Director, for questions.

SAT/ACT: Sanborn is offering an SAT prep courses this summer. This is a great opportunity to prepare yourself for the fall SAT test. Click the "Summer School" link on the high school main page or the guidance page. If you have any questions, see your guidance counselor.

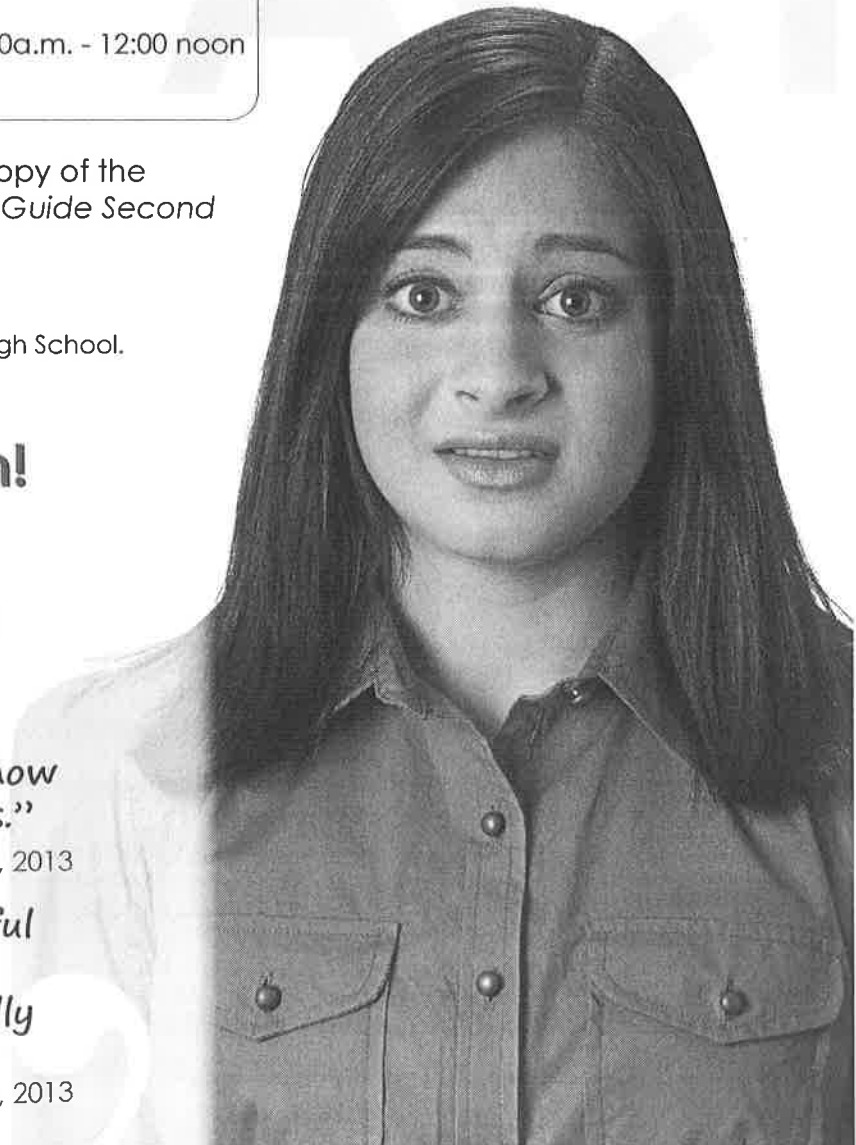
