NECC is offering a summer course aimed at improving students' scores on this assessment test-particularly those who have already taken it and scored in the Algebra II and/or College Reading, both one level below college level. If you know students who fit this category, please consider recommending this Summer Bridge Program-it can help them score better and enable them to register for college level math and science in the Fall semester!





NH Police Cadet Training Academy to be held June 25 – July 1, 2016 at NHTI.

Annual Academy aims to help men and women ages 14-20 to overcome any challenges they may face in their future careers and hopes to build essential life skills for youth.

Manchester, NH – The New Hampshire Police Cadet Training Academy is currently accepting applications for the 2016 session. Sponsored for the past 42 years by the New Hampshire Police Association and the New Hampshire Association of Chiefs of Police, the New Hampshire Police Cadet Training Academy offers young men and women ages 14 – 20 the opportunity to experience life as a police recruit. This year, the weeklong Academy will take place at the New Hampshire Technical Institute campus in Concord, New Hampshire from June 25 – July 1.

There are three academy sessions held during the same week. The Academy starts with the Basic Class, designed for the first time Cadet and is limited to 100 applicants. The Cadet who returns for the second year attends the Advanced Academy. This is limited to thirty applicants. The third year Cadets are usually very serious about a pursuing a career in law enforcement and attends the Leadership Academy. This is limited to fifteen applicants.

The Academy staff is police and corrections officers from New Hampshire and the United States Army, whose time is generously donated by the Chiefs, Directors and Selectmen. Training for all three class levels is conducted by the most prestigious law enforcement officials in local, county, state, and federal law enforcement, as well as professionals from business, media and academia. The training has both physical and educational demands, the classroom topics are fascinating, and the discipline is motivating. Registration deadline is June 8th, but applications are considered on a first come, first serve basis.

At the conclusion of the Academy, the staff awards two scholarships worth a total of \$1,500 to students continuing their education in the law enforcement or criminal justice fields. There is funding offered by the Dunbarton Police Association, Sean Powers Memorial Fund, NH Sheriff's Association and anonymous provider for assistance for applicants who may not be able to fully afford the tuition fee.





# **Juniors, Create Your Common Application Account!**

Applying to college this fall? The Common Application is an online application accepted by nearly 700 colleges and universities. Participating schools accept the Common Application in place of their own institutional application. When using the Common Application, you complete one online application (and perhaps supplemental forms for each college that you are applying to) and are able to electronically send this application to all of your chosen participating colleges. Using this form is time-saving and simplifies the application process. The Common Application and a list of participating schools can be found at www.commonapp.org

You can create your Common App account now - or whenever you are ready - and it will be available for you this fall as you start to apply to college. Essay prompts will not change for the 2016-2017 application cycle.

### SAT Scores Are Now Available!

High school juniors who took the March 2016 SAT can now check their scores by logging into www.collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat. For directions and information on how to get your scores, watch CollegeBoard's video "Understand Your SAT Score Report."

Once you have logged in to see your scores you can use these scores to enrich your college search process. You can go to BigFuture by CollegeBoard to see what SAT scores individual colleges require for admissions. CollegeBoard suggests using their SAT Convertor tool to compare your "new 1600" score with the "old 2400" scores of the freshman class at your favorite colleges. To use the convertor tool you can either download CollegeBoard's App called "SAT Score Converter" from Apple's App Store or Google Play (Android) or use the online convertor tool.

Not happy with your score? Want to get your EBRW (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) or M (Math) score up? CollegeBoard had partnered with Khan Academy to provide FREE personalized SAT prep. To begin the test prep process, log in to www.khanacademy.org/sat and upload your PSAT and SAT scores. Once tests are uploaded, Khan Academy can provide practice questions that target your specific area(s) of need and demonstrate how to get to the correct answer. Even 30 minutes twice a week of test prep can help!


