- LA CIMA Industry Leader The Latina nominated for this award either owns or works in professional services or industry specific enterprise (law, finance, transportation, technology, construction, health, etc.) and is recognized as a leader in her field. She also volunteers her time and talents to make a positive impact on professional and community organizations that serve the Hispanic community and/or community at large. (*Must be a member or become a member upon receiving the award.*)
- LA CIMA Government/Education Leader The Latina nominated for this category works in education or government and is a recognized leader in her field. She also volunteers her time and talents to make a positive impact on professional and community organizations that serve the Hispanic community and/or community at large. (Membership not required to receive the award.)
- LA CIMA Nonprofit Leader The Latina nominated for this category works for a nonprofit organization and is recognized as a leader in the nonprofit sector. She volunteers of her time and talents to make a positive impact on professional and community organizations that serve the Hispanic community and/or the community at large. (Membership not required to receive the award.)
- LA CIMA Emerging Leader The Latina nominated for this category is a college/university student or young professional (less than 3 years as a professional) who is a recognized leader. She volunteers of her time and talents to make a positive impact on student, professional and/or community organizations that serve the Hispanic community and/or the community at large. (Membership not required to receive the award.)
