

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS AND CLINICS 2014-2015 THIRD TRIMESTER

Below is a list of the after school clubs and clinics Canterbury will offer during the **third trimester** of the 2014-15 school year. These opportunities are extra-curricular, which means they fall outside of the regular educational program. The school charges a nominal \$40 fee for each trimester-long club (\$70 if the club meets twice per week as opposed to once). If a club continues for more than one trimester, the fee will be collected at the beginning of each trimester (or the entire fee can be paid at once). Some clubs also have additional fees as noted below. Clinics vary in duration and cost; each clinic is listed below along with the description, dates, and times. Study hall is available for students who have a clinic that starts after 3:15. The cost is \$10 per use (sign up by emailing Kevin Brenner at brennerk@canterburygso.org). A limited amount of financial assistance is available (contact Kelen Walker at walkerk@canterburygso.org).

Our program is designed to help develop coordination and athleticism in young children. No matter what sport your children are getting ready for, running can get them in great condition, and help them become balanced, wellrounded athletes. We teach the fundamentals using structured practices, form drills, running specific exercises, and running specific plyometrics. Our feeling is, we always want our children to learn running correctly, being physically challenged each practice, and having fun with running games designed to bring out the competitive spirit. This fun, challenging training program often will prepare Junior Crazy Runners (5 – 7 year olds) for a Fun Run event. We will focus on goal-setting and determination as we train to compete in a local event.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS ABOUT AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS AND CLINICS

Q: Is it possible for my child to participate in more than one after school activity?

A: Yes. Students may participate in more than one activity. If the dates of two activities overlap, the student must ask the activity sponsors for permission to participate in both. In some instances, the student may have to choose one activity or another.

Q: Does the \$40 fee apply to each after school club activity?

A: Yes. If your child participates in three activities, you would pay the fee for each activity. Fees will be used to compensate our staff.

Q: When/how will I learn about the details of each activity?

A: The activity sponsors will provide students with additional information about their activities. General announcements such as starting dates, meeting places, and tryouts will be made in the *Chatter*. More specific announcements about activity requirements, payment due dates, etc. will be communicated in a variety of ways by the activity sponsors.

Q: When do I send my money and where do I send it?

A: Club sponsors will alert you to payment totals and due dates and collect all payments from students. Checks should be made payable to Canterbury School. Payments should NOT be sent in now. Payment for clinics should be sent in with the registration form in order to reserve a spot for your child. Checks should be made payable to Canterbury School with the name of the clinic on the memo line.

Q: How does this impact Extended Day?

A: Extended Day students may participate in the after school program if they pay the activity fee. Students will be sent to Extended Day each day as soon as their activity is over. There will be no reduction in Extended Day fees because a student participates in an after school activity.

Q: Is it possible for my child to wait on campus for an after school clinic to start?

A: Children enrolled in a 3:15 or 3:20pm club or clinic will be sent directly to that location when school is dismissed for the day. Children enrolled in a clinic that begins later than 3:15 or 3:20pm may stay on campus IF they are registered for after school study hall, which is offered only to children enrolled in after school arts classes and after school clinics. Children will be dismissed from study hall to go to their clinic. A child who is not registered for after school study hall may not stay on campus unsupervised.

Q: How much does study hall cost and how and when do I pay for it?

A: Study hall costs \$10 per day. You will be billed bi-monthly. As soon as you receive confirmation that your child is enrolled in an after school clinic, email Kevin Brenner at brenner-k@canterburygso.org to reserve a spot if needed. Study hall will run each afternoon from 3:15-5:15pm.

Q: If I have more questions, whom do I call?
