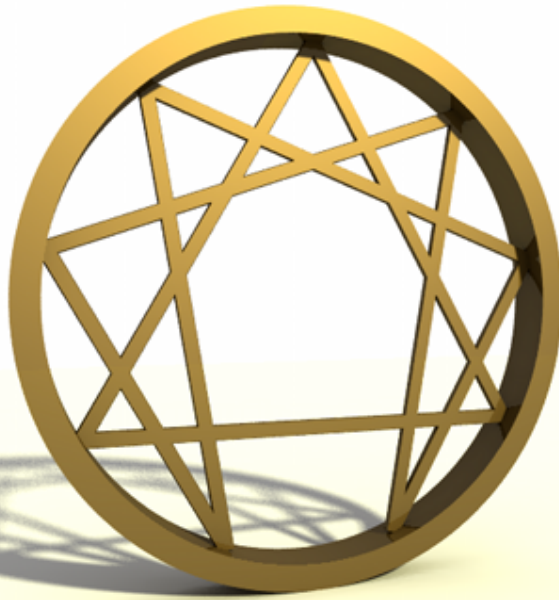


The Enneagram:

Charles R. Snyder is a staff member of The Presbyterian Church in Coshocton, OH with a focus in music ministry. Since 1987, he has been leading Enneagram classes and workshops with adult church school classes, with chaplains at BSA National Camping Schools, with youth officers of the Ohio Farm Bureau, and with staff members and counselors-in-training at his summer music camps. He currently leads his church's music ministry, which includes eight vocal and handbell choirs. Chuck's music ministry extends into the community, surrounding counties, and around the state with the Coshocton Community Choir, the Coshocton Children's Choir, the Coshocton Youth Chorale, the touring Cardinal Chorale, and the newly-established *Encore!* Honors Choir.

What is the Enneagram?

Enneagram (Greek for "nine points") helps us identify our major gift (as well as its shadow side). It can encourage us to grow and provides indicators of imbalance, as well as possibilities for regaining a balanced perspective.

On this retreat, we'll begin to discover how each lens has an intuitive eye that helps us focus on some things with remarkable clarity. We'll look at the blind spots in our lenses that keep us from seeing part of what others may see (an area where we are especially sensitive and touchy). But more than that, knowledge of the Enneagram can help us understand how each perspective - each lens - is vital to the body of Christ: it takes every one to make it complete.
