In March 2005, Bishop William Murphy requested that a foundation be put together that would be dedicated to helping sustain and improve Long Island's

Catholic elementary schools. Our Chairman Lewis Ranieri responded by assembling a superb board of prominent professionals, business leaders and diocesan administrators, many of whom are with us still. From that point on, parents seeking scholarship aid have applied to Tomorrow's Hope to enable their children to reap the lifelong benefits of our academically rigorous, faith-based Catholic schools.

Since 2005, we have awarded over 13,000 scholarships for a total of \$15 million in scholarships and school aid. In 2014 alone, we awarded \$1.6 million in scholarships, which will enable 1,900 k-8th grade students to attend our schools.

Thanks to the continuing support of individual donors and corporate sponsors, our special events remain highly successful. In 2014, our golf outings and our gala collectively raised over \$1.5 million. Currently, we are in the process of planning our 10th Anniversary gala. We look forward to making our decennial dinner our best ever.

In addition, Tomorrow's Hope created two pivotal programs: our Adopt-A-School program, which encourages Long Island corporations to support a specific school in our network; and our STARS program, which matches donors with low-income students, who, in turn, send letters and progress reports to their sponsors.

These are just some of the ways in which our generous donors have collaborated with Tomorrow's Hope over the past decade to help today's children take advantage of the academic, spiritual and civic benefits of Catholic education. As we enter the New Year, we look forward to working with you to ensure that these benefits continue to be available for as many students as possible. To accomplish that, we are also putting in place a comprehensive grants, major gifts and planned giving program for our overall development plan.


