Peace Camp is a day camp for children ages 5-14, held at UUCA in collaboration with Little Friends for Peace. With a 4:1 camper staff ratio, Peace Camp seeks to create and nourish an intergenerational community among persons of different faiths, cultures, races, and ethnic backgrounds.



At Peace Camp, youth discover that peace begins with them! Peace Camp offers campers the opportunity to explore cooperation and conflict resolution in a safe and supportive environment. Campers are taught skills to deal with their problems in a peaceful manner and are encouraged to come up with their own creative solutions to the problems they see at camp, at home, at school, and in the world.
