

# 2015 Goodwill Youth Services Summer Bridge Application

#### Our mission

The mission of the Goodwill Summer Bridge Mentoring group is to assist first generation college students in making the transition from high school to college successfully by providing post-secondary readiness curriculum and mentor support.

### Mentoring

Goodwill will provide students with support that is above and beyond what a typical college student receives. Students in this program are matched with a mentor who will provide support and guidance. Mentors and students will participate in a nine-week summer program designed to prepare students for college life. Mentors stay connected with students for the duration of one year providing support and encouragement to help ensure that students are successful.

In this exciting and interactive summer program students learn about:

- Time management/Study skills
- Utilizing campus resources
- Assertive communication
- Making healthy choices in college

### **On-Campus Support**

Students selected for this program will receive on-campus support. A Goodwill Post Secondary Retention Coordinator will serve as a guide, supporting students after high school graduation in order to support the successful completion of a college degree. This will be done through individual coaching and support, and skill-building activities focused on student needs and obstacles faced in college.

When students meet with a Post-Secondary Retention Coordinator they will receive:

- Free tutoring resources
- Scholarship support
- Help with finding jobs
- Leadership and volunteer opportunities

Students are required to be in contact with a Post Secondary Retention Coordinator at least once per month.

#### Leadership

As part of this program, students will be able to grow and develop into leaders in their community. Students will serve as a positive influence for other students who may need additional support.

Students will be offered multiple volunteer opportunities:

- College panels
- Community service
- Ambassadors at Goodwill community events
- Peer Mentoring

Through this volunteer work we hope students will provide support and serve as role models for younger people who may need help.



## **Qualifications:**

- Attending an accredited non-profit Colorado college, university, or technical college for the 2015-16 school year. (Please see attached list)
- Have a high school diploma or GED by the time the program starts.
- Complete and submit the Free Application for Federal student aid (FAFSA) students will need to verify this by summiting the FAFSA confirmation page).

#### **Requirements:**

- Participants <u>must</u> be enrolled in an accredited non-profit Colorado college, university, or technical college for the 2015-16 school year.
- Participants <u>must</u> be able to attend <u>ALL</u> Summer Bridge meetings in addition to a student orientation, celebration banquet, and winter holiday party. Summer Bridge meetings will be held once a week.
- Participants <u>must</u> keep in contact with their mentor at least once a month for the full duration of the 2015-16 academic year.

### Student Checklist:

- Submit a completed application to Goodwill or a Goodwill staff member by 4:30pm on Friday, March 20th. Applications will be reviewed as they are received. Early applications are encouraged.
- Provide a copy of student's high school transcript (ask your counselor or Goodwill facilitator)
- □ Provide typed essays.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>. Please include FAFSA confirmation page with Expected Family Contribution (EFC) in the application.
- □ Candidates will be evaluated by the accuracy & completion of their application packet and by the completion of an interview by Goodwill staff.
- □ Interviews will be scheduled from March 23<sup>rd</sup> -April 17<sup>th</sup> 2015.
