As Africa and its diaspora commemorate 50 years of post-independence Pan-Africanism, *Africa's Peacemakers* examines critical lessons of peacemaking, socio-economic justice, women's rights, environmental protection, and nuclear disarmament from the 13 prominent individuals of African descent who have won the Nobel Peace Prize since 1950.
