I am very proud to say that this past January 6th I celebrated one full year as Principal of St. Thomas the Apostle School. It has been exciting, fun, and an invigorating year filled with new passions for me both professionally and personally. It has been a pleasure to work with the faculty, form relationships with the parents and to serve the students.

I felt at this time it is important to provide this letter to you along with a "state" of where we are as a school here at STA. This is not a list just to showcase personal accomplishments-but rather an overview of the new/updated programs, security, curriculum, communication and technology incorporated in order to EXPAND ourselves for the one group we are all here for-our children.

We are a strong catholic school of almost 400 students and we are looking and planning to expand our Pre K, add new technology and programs in all our grades and continue the teachings of Jesus Christ.

This "state" of the school will reinforce that STA is strong, is growing and expanding. A parent had emailed me today to ask if tuition was raised because the Pre K program was in trouble. My answer is NO! We expanded the Pre K program in order to accommodate the many parents who call and ask for admittance as well as providing the opportunity for parents with various schedules. In essence, we have hired Mrs. Gray as a FULL TIME Pre K teacher, expanded services for Pre K with dedicated tablets for technology and leveled readers and to include library, spanish, art, music and gym for our 5 day 4 year old program. THIS is how we continue to provide a "feeder" system for grades K-8. We emphasize that we are an academic environment from Pre K, right up to the eighth grade.

The Pre K program must stand alone as we hope grades k-8 will do so in the near future. We are attempting to not only reduce, but cut the subsidy from the church to zero. This will allow us to be independent financially and stand alone, unlike many Catholic schools that are not able to do.. There will be NO closing, NO discussion of merging, we are already receiving applications from other schools. If there is an issue concerning tuition for you, please come and see me or go directly to Walt in the business office. He is more than willing to assist in whatever means necessary. We are here to assist and keep you here!

I also see OUR accomplishments as a collaborative effort among all of us; parents, parish, faculty/staff and administration. Our Catholic Education is so very important and necessary to provide our children with skills needed for their future education and to instill in them the faith they will need in this ever changing and challenging world.

STA has a tradition since 1956 in providing our students with pride and a strong faith based education. I am here to continue that tradition of molding our students into STA strong and updating/upgrading 21st century skills and programs in order for them to be prepared not only for high school, but for life. I have listed some of our accomplishments in the past year due to the unselfish work, assistance, support of all of you; faculty/staff, the parish, parents and volunteers.

I have also included scheduled plans for the 2015-2016 school year, all of which will assist in making STA the Catholic School of Destination in our area. Our goal is to grow as a student centered school surrounded by a safe and respectful environment.

I thank you all for your support during the past year. We have much to be proud of in our accomplishments, but rest assured, we are not done-there is so much more to do and TOGETHER we will continue to grow and succeed.
